# **Purpose**

The Cameroon Academy of Young Scientists (CAYS) over the years has greatly contributed to seeking operational solutions to fill existing gaps across biological sciences, social sciences, and physical sciences. Access to material science, artificial intelligence, ICT, data science, health, food security, climate, and environment as well as entrepreneurship and innovation just to enumerate a few. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual international conference to be organized by CAYS. This international conference coincides with the 5th anniversary of CAYS. Preconference workshops on Science Leadership, Scientific and Grant writing will be organized.

Cameroon, just like any other Country in Africa and the World, is plagued with problems across food, water security, climate and environment, health, ICT, digital economy, and development. But there is a widening gap in knowledge and capacity in being part of the solution and not the problem. Therefore, there is an urgent need to expose early and mid-career scientists to the actual existing problems across sectors and share best practices. Furthermore, how can early and mid-career scientists contribute to the sustainable development amid inherent challenges? Some of these challenges include underdevelopment, poverty and inadequate capital, unfavorable ecosystem, and rising inflation. Obviously, Youth Entrepreneurs help drive change in economies via innovation, creation of new markets with their products and services thereby contributing to national income, growth of other sectors and over-all economic development.

In this regard, the CAYS is organizing the third international conference that will take place from September 28 to 30, 2023 (03 days). This international conference will create platforms for research findings on different sub-themes for participant capacity building and best practices sharing.



# Specific Objectives and expected outcomes

## Specific Objectives

- Bring together scientists from different horizons, disciplines and levels (students, early career research scientists and experts) and facilitate discussions and learning sessions through various presentation formats: plenary, oral and poster presentations, roundtables, and workshops.
- Foster interdisciplinarity dialogue to create opportunities for collaborative research;
- Give opportunity to early career researchers and young scientists to disseminate their research, and establish network for professional development;
- Provide an opportunity to enhance knowledge and skills, build capacities of early and mid-career researchers;
- Discuss the challenges and opportunities of digitalization and technological development.

At the end of the workshops and conference, the Cameroon Academy of Young Scientists (CAYS) will empower early and mid-career scientists with advances in their field of research. This 3rd Edition of the international conference which is also CAYS's 5th anniversary shall be given a very wide media coverage and outreach to the social media community through a rigorous communication and visibility plan.

The "SX" refer the session the author is postulating for. Hence the 'SX' could be SA or SB or SC regarding the various conference sessions.
